## How Does COVID-19 Virus Spread?

Coronaviruses are spread mainly from person to person through close contact. For example, in a household, workplace or health care centre. There is no vaccine available at the moment to protect against the 2019 novel coronavirus.

#### **Ontario Ministry of Health advises all residents to:**

- Practice Social Distancing. Avoid close contact with people outside of your immediate family. Close contact includes being within 2 meters of another person.
- Avoid all travel outside of Canada.
- Self-isolate for 14 days upon your return from travel outside of Canada.


There are everyday actions that can help prevent the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses. Take these everyday steps to reduce exposure to the virus and protect your health:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Cough and sneeze into your sleeve or a tissue. Dispose of tissue immediately and wash your hands.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Keep surfaces clean and disinfected.

#### What are the Symptoms?

If you need emergency medical attention, you should call 911 and mention your travel history and symptoms.



## Tax Penalties Waived During COVID-19

The 60 day grace period, will end on June 30th, and it is for the April 28, 2020 instalment.

## City of Pickering Extends Closures and Cancellations to May



Closures include Chestnut Hill Developments Recreation Complex, Pickering Animal Shelter, Pickering Museum Village, community centres, arenas, and off-leash dog parks. In addition, all playground structures and park amenities

including basketball courts, tennis courts, sports fields, gazebos, splash pads, skateboard parks, and park parking lots will also be closed.

While closed to the public, Pickering City Hall and the Operations Centre remain minimally staffed to ensure the continued delivery of essential and critical services. All Pickering Public Library branches remain closed, but virtual services can be accessed at picnet.org/digitalresources.

Spring leisure programs (including aquatics, fitness, and leisure programs) have been cancelled, and registration for summer 2020 is on hold until further notice. All Pickering Public Library in-house programs have been cancelled until May 31, 2020.

Permits for private events at City facilities, including Library rooms, will be cancelled until May 3, 2020, and refunds will be issued. Permits for sports fields are suspended until May 25, 2020, and no permits for the Summer Ice Program will be issued until further notice.

Additionally, the following City and community-organized events have also been impacted: Petapolooza, Artfest, Whitevale Spring Festival, Easter Parade, D-Day Ceremony & Parade, Ajax-Pickering Rotary Ribfest, Pickering Dragon Boat Festival, and the Adobo Festival.
