



Highway 401 Pedestrian Bridge

There's a new look in Downtown Pickering. Construction nears completion on Pickering's landmark pedestrian bridge. Spanning 250 metres across Highway 401, Canada's busiest highway, this fully enclosed bridge will be accessible to both pedestrians and cyclists.





December saw the final truss installed, connecting the bridge to another downtown landmark. A 132,000 square foot, LEED Silver office tower supported by a 500 stall GO parking deck is now the new home of the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation. Filling out the tenancy is Ontario Power Generation.

To complete the office tower, the City is now reviewing plans for the Pickering Learning Centre - a two storey, 10,000 square-foot post secondary school facility, developed through a partnership between Durham College and Centennial College. Programs are planned to commence in the fall of 2012.

Making Neighbourhoods Safer

As I commented to residents, there are a number of traffic and pedestrian safety improvements I have been pursuing including: sidewalks along Kingston Road, intersection improvements and community Centre parking lot in Claremont, playground at Nature Haven Drive, guiderail on Valley Farm Road, new bridge and lighting in Whitevale, all-way stops on Dellbrook Drive and Major Oaks Road, consideration of all-way stops on Hogarth Sreet and Woodview Drive, repair of railway crossings, and improvements to 6th Concession Road and Greenridge Drive in Greenwood to name a few.

Here are a few examples of the services, programs and projects included in the City 2011 City Budget:

City Programs - including fire protection, parks, seniors snow removal, libraries, recreation centres and programs, road maintenance and plowing.

Third Concession Road – east of Brock Road – urbanization includes widening to 4 lanes, bicycle lanes, sidewalk & multi use trail

Valley Farm Road – safety guiderail south of Greenmount Street

Brock Road – sidewalk & streetlights from Third Concession to Taunton Rd.

William Street – asphalt repairs and final lift of asphalt

Sideline 4 – limestone resurfacing and improvements

Claremont Community Centre – parking lot paving

Kingston Road - sidewalks

East Shore Community Centre – parking lot expansion

Civic Complex – courtyard and walkway improvements

Nature Haven Park – walkway, curb & junior play units

Claremont Park – tennis court resurfacing & fencing

Brockridge Park – upgrading play areas

Don Beer Memorial Park – park relocation in Brougham

Marinet Crescent/Bayley St. - noise barrier

West Shore Boulevard - reconstruction

Liverpool Rd. South - reconstruction and sidewalk

Pickering Council Approves Shark Fin Ban
